The New Amsterdam Trail audio walking tour commemorates Henry Hudson's voyage for the Dutch to New York 400 years ago and the settlement of the island of Manhattan. Today, the unique character of New York City, then New Amsterdam, is a legacy of the multiethnic, entrepreneurial and tolerant culture of 17th century Amsterdam. The tour takes you to the important historic sites of the Dutch settlement and tells fascinating stories on how each place fits into the larger arc of New York City history.
